#### Do you have Irish Heritage?

If so, you're not alone! Between 1800 and 1900, almost 8 million people left Ireland to find a better life. Almost 2 million came between 1841 and 1860 at the height of the Great Famine.

Irish research can be time-consuming and frustrating due to the lack of records. 1800-20 is typically the cut-off point for finding detailed Irish genealogical information. A devastating fire in 1922 destroyed most of the 1821-1891 censuses, and many Church of Ireland parish records and wills were also lost. Later census returns were recycled to support a 1914-18 war paper shortage. Irish Research is getting easier as more records are digitized and as DNA becomes

records are digitized and as DNA becomes more widely available. Hopefully these resources will be helpful to you in discovering some of your Irish roots.

This Month's Genealogy Term: Indentured servant

An indentured servant or indentured laborer is an employee (indenture) within a system of unfree labor who is bound by a signed or forced contract (indenture) to work for a particular employer for a fixed time. The contract often lets the employer sell the labor of an indenturee to a third party. Indenturees usually enter into an indenture for a specific payment or other benefit, or to meet a legal obligation, such as debt bondage. On completion of the contract, indentured servants were given their freedom, and occasionally plots of land. In many countries, systems of indentured labor have now been outlawed, and are banned by the Universal Declaration of Human Rights as a form of slavery. *Source: Wikipedia*
