### Library Improvements:

- As part of our educational efforts, some of the Humble House computers have been set up so users can watch webinars from RootsWeb and FamilySearch.
- ▶ Our pilot program to test putting our library catalog on-line is proceeding well. Thanks to the efforts of our project manager Ron and intern Sierra we're close to finishing entering our Washington titles into the new on-line catalog. Next steps are to test our search features and evaluate if we need to make any changes in our indexing, and start working on the next block of entries.

If you can type and are interested in helping us with entering the books into the catalog please call the library and leave a message for Ron Sailer, and he'll get back to you. With a total of some 5,000 titles to enter, we can use definitely use any help you can give us!

# Reinforcing Your Research

### FAN Research

FAN Research, also known as cluster or collateral research, has you look at your ancestors' Family, Associates, and Neighbors. Studying the people around your relatives can be valuable in helping you sort through situations where you can't seem to find anything, or where you find too much. It's also useful when trying to separate individuals with similar names, ages and residences.
