

Genealogy Terms

Abstracts, Extracts and Transcripts

- Abstract : a summary of the text of a document, retaining all the essential details.
- **Extract**: a word-for-word copy of selected portions of the document. Often helpful for removing long legal "boilerplate" language
- **Transcript**: a complete word-for-word copy of the document, including all spelling, grammar, and punctuation errors.



Check the states you're researching for digital archives; more and more are coming on-line. WA has one of the best. Be sure to look for State censuses - they may have more info than the federal ones!

Do You Know?

Reclaim the Records has announced that there is now a New York City GEOGRAPHIC Birth Index. Unlike the more typical birth indexes arranged by surname or date, this one is arranged by the child's place of birth, the actual exact street address! Make sure to read their introduction on how the cards are indexed; most are not yet indexed.
