



# **Working with Probate Records**

Probate is the court-supervised process of validating a will if the deceased made one. Probate steps are similar even if there isn't a will, and includes identifying assets and determining their value, paying outstanding bills and taxes, determining the care of dependents, and distributing the remainder of the estate to their rightful beneficiaries. Each state has specific laws in place, and there is generally a special probate court with its own judge. (Source: <u>Balance.com: What is probate?</u>)

<u>Testate</u>: a person who died having made and left a legally valid will <u>Intestate</u>: a person who died having made no will, or whose will is found not legally valid.

- ▶ That LOSHO (the League of Snohomish County Heritage Organizations) is taking an inventory of historical assets across unincorporated Snohomish County, and that they maintain a mapping system that allows users to overlay a variety of vintage maps accurately scaled to match modern survey references? The maps allow users to easily compare the historical maps (including homestead lines) and modern parcel surveys and aerial photographs. You can find more information on their website.
- ▶ That Microsoft reversed course on discontinuing support for the OneNote 2016 desktop app? After a lot of feedback from its customers about discontinuing the desktop version (where you could have your notebooks on your own local drive), it announced in October that it will continue supporting and (restart) making improvements until at least 2025.
