Genealogy Research Tools

Research Help

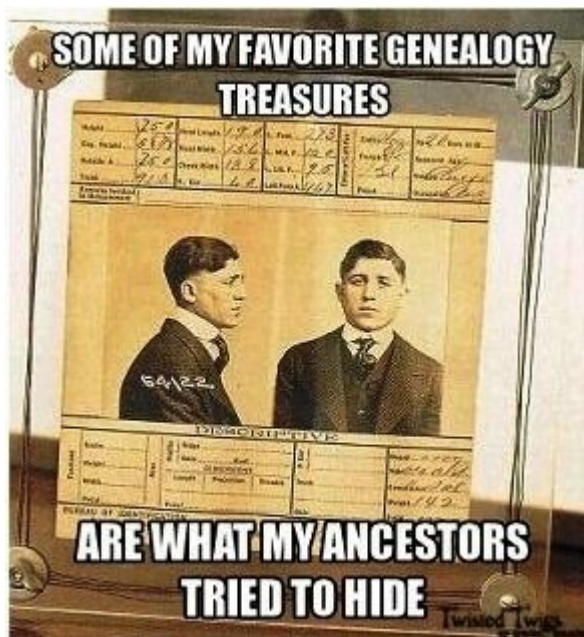
While browsing around the internet a tool came to our attention called [GoldieMay](#). GoldieMay is a Chrome Extension that helps to organize and track your genealogy research.

Within GoldieMay you can turn on an Automatic Research Log. This will track your research sites and also allow you to write notes and save screenshots about the page you visited. Workspace Management lets you open a bunch of research tabs at once then ask GoldieMay to remember all those tabs into a "workspace". When you want to reopen those tabs just click the workspace you created in GoldieMay.

Are citations a problem? GoldieMay can create instant FamilySearch or Ancestry citations. No copy and paste! Use the Subway Map to make sure you're ancestor's timeline makes sense, or compare their timeline to another ancestor to see overlaps and divides.

This is only a few of the things GoldieMay provides for helping with your genealogy research. GoldieMay is available with a free version or a subscription version; not all items outlined above are available in the free version. Check them out at www.GoldieMay.com* to learn more.
